



2014 | Grant Recipients based on Knowledge Open scores

Appleton Career Academy – \$150 – Funds will support field trips for students.

Appleton Public Montessori – \$275 – Grant will fund business startup costs related to a partnership with a local bakery.

Badger Elementary School - \$1,233 – Grant will purchase sound systems for two classrooms to improve the ability for students to hear teachers.

Edison Elementary School – \$650 – Funds will benefit Edison’s Project Starfish Fund, which provides grants to economically disadvantaged students for resources they otherwise would not be able to obtain on their own.

Einstein Middle School – \$2,200 – Funds will be used to repurpose the library media center and purchase Chromebooks and charging stations.

Ferber Elementary School – \$400 – Books will be purchased for classrooms and the bookroom.

Foster Elementary School – \$600 – The grant will help purchase a television to be installed near the building’s entrance for announcements and schedules.

Horizons Elementary School – \$275 – The grant will fund buddy activities on the playground.

Huntley Elementary School – \$250 – Funds will help purchase Chromebooks for students in grades K-2.

Jefferson Elementary School – \$150 – Funds will support onsite staff development for increased teacher effectiveness.

Johnston Elementary School – \$850 – The grant will be used to purchase Chromebooks.

Kaleidoscope Academy – \$150 – Funds will support advances in technology.

Lincoln Elementary School – \$150 – Grant will support upgrades to outdoor basketball hoops and foursquare facilities.

Madison Middle School – \$150 – Funds will purchase supplies for “target time.” A time for students to receive additional instruction in reading and math.

North High School – \$150 – Funds will purchase equipment for a new “Life Skills” facility for students with special needs.

Richmond Elementary School – \$1,683 – Grant will be used to purchase Chromebooks for students in grades 1-2.

Roosevelt Middle School – \$800 – Funds will support advances in technology.

West High School – \$1,783 – Grant will go toward the purchase of new bleachers, part of West’s athletic field project.

Wilson Middle School – \$250 – Funds will go toward registration fees for “Quality Teaching for Today’s Teens” – a 3-day workshop hosted by CESA6.
